
Arrangements for the Remembrance Service on the 11th November will be published on the Pateley Bridge Town Council website.

Vehicle Activated Sign

Data was collected from the VAS for vehicles approaching Pateley Bridge from South Easterly direction. In total, the VAS recorded a staggering 1,206,517 vehicles entering Pateley Bridge from the Ripon Road direction between March and September 2021.

The chart below shows that of that number, the vast majority of vehicles were not exceeding the speed limit of 30MPH. Of those that were in excess of the speed limit, IE those whose speed would have caused the sign to illuminate, the vast majority were on average, doing 35MPH. However, over 40,000 vehicles approached at speeds of up to 45MPH, with a small number approaching in excess of that. Though it should be noted that some of those doing 50+ MPH will have been emergency vehicles on a blue light.

To the vast majority of drivers who keep to the speed limit in our town, a huge thank you. To those tempted to break the speed limit: Please think not only of your safety, but the safety of others, particularly pedestrians, and those who live just off the Ripon road. Please, please slow down.



Local issues

The Town Council appreciates residents informing us of local issues and will try and help to resolve problems where it can. Many issues such as those relating to highways or parking can be really disruptive to residents but are not within the Town Council's control. The Town Council will investigate and report issues to the appropriate authority which currently may be Harrogate Borough Council or North Yorkshire County Council. Recent examples include a request for a residents parking scheme on Millfield Street and a request for double yellow lines on Greenwood Road. Unfortunately, North Yorkshire County Council have advised that neither of these schemes will be implemented.

Pateley Bridge Town Council will continue to represent the views of local residents and provide support and information.

Keep Pateley Bridge Tidy!

Once again, The Council has received reports of the misuse of the Southlands Recycling Centre on Nidd Walk and would like to issue another reminder that any misuse may result in the removal of the facility which would be a real loss. The recycling bins in Southlands are provided by HBC and are for domestic use, not for commercial or charity waste. Please don't deposit other household rubbish around the bins – this is flytipping, a criminal offence which also creates extra costs to taxpayers to have it removed. Again, these bins are not for the use of businesses who must use a commercial contractor or visit the Harrogate or Ripon permanent sites.

Please help to keep the area tidy.
