It feels like a long time ago now, but PBTC hopes that you enjoyed the festive lights back in December.
PBTC would like to thank the former Harrogate Borough Council (HBC) for its £2,500 contribution and North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC) for its £1,000 grant.
Very importantly, the council would also like to thank local businesses and members of the public who generously donated a total of £737 via the shop collection points at Dales Market Corner and The Spar, as well as the Just Giving

webpage. Installing, dismantling, maintaining, and storing lights is always very expensive. Many of the lights that PBTC owns are old and nearing the end of their life. With your help, we have been able to replace some of them ready for the 2023 display. We hope to be able to continue this programme of replacing lights in 2024.

Going forward, with the recent move to an integrated North Yorkshire Council (NYC), we are not sure what county council funding will be available for Christmas lighting. However, we can assure you we will do our best to secure enough funds to ensure that residents and visitors to Pateley Bridge can continue to enjoy the festive display into the future.

Harrogate Borough Council's (now North Yorkshire Council's) recent roll-out of the new high-capacity bins has had a mixed reception. PBTC is aware of problems with the solar bins on the High Street in Pateley Bridge. Occasionally rubbish overflows onto the street and local businesses have felt the need to step in and pick it up. Thank you to them for their help with this. It should clearly not be necessary. We are working closely with North Yorkshire Council to smooth out the teething problems with these high-tech bins and to ensure that there are enough bins and collections to meet demand. When HBC rolled out the new bins, it chose to remove all the bins in the Recreation Ground in favour of some larger capacity bins at the edge of it. Bewerley Parish Council (BPC) and PBTC felt that having no bins at all in the Recreation Ground would not be a welcome change for the town. It therefore arranged to keep 3 bins in there, which would be emptied by BPC and PBTC. At peak times the bins have had to be emptied daily to keep on top of the situation. Even then they do sometimes overflow. These bins have been kept for the convenience of residents and visitors. To help us keep this arrangement going, please ensure that if the bin you wish to put something in is full, that you take it to another close by bin which still has room left. Please do not leave your litter at the side of any bin.

There are very large capacity bins directly outside the Recreation Ground, which usually have plenty of

Thereafter, the current plan is for the Youth Council to meet on the first and third Monday of each month. In due course, the council itself will decide how often it meets. Support Of Local Good Causes

In January, the Mayor's Fund granted £240 to Nidderdale Fell and Trail to train 2 club members as UK Athletes fully-qualified 'Leaders in Running Fitness'. This was to facilitate the fast growth of the running club and accommodate the large number of people wanting to take part in organised runs.

The Mayor's Fund also contributed £250 towards a new commercial oven for use in the kitchen in Dacre and Hartwith Village Hall.

PBTC has granted £200 to each of the warm space initiatives at St. Cuthbert's Church and Pateley Bridge & Bewerley Memorial Hall.
